This FREE theatre class is for anybody with a disability who has a story to tell!

People with disabilities are often excluded from participating in the arts because of inaccessible venues and/or lack of transportation. This FREE class led by writer, director, storyteller and performer Tekki Lomnicki is held at St. Martin's, a fully accessible venue, and funds are available for participants' transportation if needed.

In this class you will learn how to generate ideas and write your story using setting, character development, movement and music in a safe nurturing environment. A fun, learning experience this class could lead to an invitation to a free acting workshop that culminates in a full performance in a theatre.

Tekki Lomnicki, a performer with a disability, is the Artistic Director of Tellin' Tales Theatre, a company dedicated to shattering the barriers between the disabled and non-disabled worlds through the power of personal story. She has taught for Victory Gardens Theatre, Bodies of Work, Tellin' Tales Theatre, Prop Theater, Gallery 37 and After School Matters.

This program is presented by Tellin' Tales Theatre and Bodies of Work, a program of the Department of Disability and Human Development at the University of Illinois at Chicago with funding from the Chicago Community Trust. Admission is free. Space is limited to 8 participants.
